ONE TRAFFIC LANE OPEN ON THE NEW BELFAST ROAD BRIDGE

The Christchurch Northern Corridor (CNC) Alliance team is making good progress to open Guthries Road and both lanes on the Belfast Road Bridge in early November this year.

To complete the tie in with the existing road, westbound traffic on Belfast Road will already have to use the new Belfast Road Bridge **from Monday 8 October.**

The eastbound lane on Belfast Road (between Blakes Road and Crawford Road) will stay closed till early November when we can open both lanes on the bridge.

To visit the Belfast Cemetery, enter Belfast Road from Marshland Road, go over the bridge and enter at the normal access gate.

We plan to open Guthries Road and both traffic lanes on the Belfast Road Bridge on Saturday 3 November. Your invitation to our opening will be attached to this notice.

This work is weather dependent so the dates for the tie in and the opening may change.

The detour for eastbound traffic via Blakes Road, Hawkins Road, Radcliffe Road and Marshland Road stays in place till the opening of both lanes on the bridge.

Please note that there will be a 30km/h speed limit on parts of Belfast Road and on Guthries Road due to loose chips.

LANDSCAPING AND URBAN DESIGN

For the planting all along the new motorway and local road bridges we have selected species that: best fit in with the environment, allow pedestrian and vehicle sightlines for safety and are appropriate species for drainage swales and high water table areas.

To further enhance the local planting character, all the native plants must originate from the Canterbury Ecological Region. When the project is complete we will have planted well over 600 thousands plants and 442 native trees along the motorway and the shared pedestrian/cycle pathway. This is the biggest landscape job in the South Island.
